Journey along America's spectacular Atlantic Coast on an unforgettable exploration from the windswept beaches of North Carolina's Outer Banks to the timeless charm of Cape Cod and New England. Experience breathtaking scenery, rich maritime history, charming seaside communities, scenic ferry crossings, and unforgettable coastal adventures along the way!

Day 1: Settle into your comfortable motorcoach as we begin our scenic journey to one of America's most captivating coastal destinations: the Outer Banks of North Carolina. Stretching more than 100 miles along the Atlantic Ocean, these narrow barrier islands are known for their windswept beaches, charming seaside villages, rich maritime heritage, and breathtaking natural beauty.

Before arriving at our hotel, we'll visit the legendary Wright Brothers National Memorial, where Orville and Wilbur Wright achieved the world's first successful powered flight on December 17, 1903. Standing atop Big Kill Devil Hill, you'll have the opportunity to explore the visitor center, view fascinating exhibits chronicling the brothers' determination and ingenuity, and walk the grounds where aviation history was made. Monument markers tracing the path of the first four flights provide a remarkable perspective on an achievement that forever changed the world. Our home for the next 2 nights is the beautiful Sanderling Resort.

Day 2: Following breakfast, prepare for one of the signature experiences of your journey as we travel to the northern beaches of Corolla for an unforgettable Wild Horse Safari. Climb aboard specially designed four-wheel-drive vehicles and venture on to the sandy shoreline in search of the legendary Colonial Spanish Mustangs that have roamed these remote beaches for more than 500 years. Believed to be descendants of horses brought to the New World by Spanish explorers, these remarkable animals continue to live wild and free among the dunes, a truly remarkable sight found in only a handful of places across the country.

Knowledgeable local guides will share fascinating stories about the horses' history, their unique habitat, and the ongoing conservation efforts that help protect this treasured herd. Along the way, you'll also enjoy spectacular coastal scenery, expansive beaches, and impressive oceanfront homes tucked among the dunes.

After your safari adventure, spend time discovering the village of Corolla, where beautifully preserved historic buildings, unique boutiques, inviting cafes, and scenic waterfront views create an atmosphere unlike anywhere else along the Outer Banks. The grounds surrounding the iconic Currituck Beach Lighthouse offer wonderful opportunities for photographs while also providing a glimpse into the region's rich maritime past.

Our tour of The Outer Banks continues as we discover Fort Raleigh National Historic Site. Here, we meet our local expert guide to hear about the history of this veritable birthplace of European Settlement in America. Our final stop is the beautiful Elizabethan Gardens before returning to the Sanderling Inn,

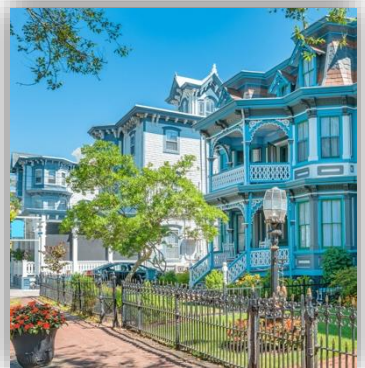
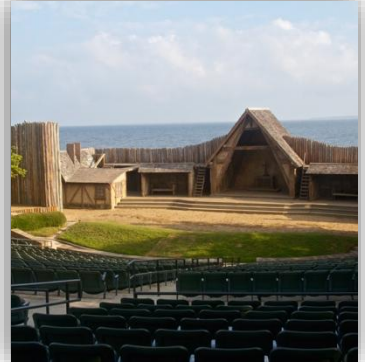
Day 3: After breakfast, bid farewell to North Carolina's picturesque Outer Banks as we continue our journey north along the Atlantic coastline. Relax and enjoy the ever-changing scenery as we travel North, crossing the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel, passing coastal communities, and picturesque landscapes on our way to one of America's most beloved seaside destinations, the Victorian resort town of Cape May, NJ

Upon arrival, we'll make a stop at the iconic Cape May Lighthouse, standing proudly within Cape May Point State Park since 1859. One of the country's oldest continually operating lighthouses, this treasured landmark has guided countless mariners safely along New Jersey's southern coast for more than 165 years. Take in the coastal views, capture photographs, and enjoy a chance to stretch your legs before continuing into the heart of this charming seaside community. Check into The Grand Hotel Cape May, then enjoy the evening amidst the beautifully preserved Victorian architecture.

Day 4: Following breakfast, experience Cape May from an entirely different perspective as we board a scenic Dolphin Watch Cruise. Cruise the waters where the Delaware Bay meets the Atlantic Ocean while knowledgeable guides share information about the area's local wildlife and unique coastal ecosystem. Keep your eyes peeled, as playful Atlantic bottlenose dolphins are frequently spotted swimming alongside the vessel, birds fly overhead, and panoramic views of Cape May's picturesque shoreline provide unforgettable memories.

Following our cruise, enjoy free time along Washington Street Mall, Cape May's charming pedestrian district. Enjoy lunch on your own while browsing local boutiques, art galleries, and specialty shops. This afternoon, we'll continue our scenic journey north as we travel to the celebrated villages of The Hamptons, located on the eastern end of Long Island, NY. Known for its beaches, grand estates, picturesque harbors, and beauty, this renowned destination has long been a favorite of many vacationers. Check into our hotel and enjoy the dinner scene in downtown Riverhead.

Day 5: Following breakfast, set out to discover the timeless charm of The Hamptons as our local guide leads us through historic villages, scenic shorelines, and beautifully preserved communities. Each stop will offer a unique glimpse into the character and traditions that have defined Long Island's East End for generations. Travel through the historic villages of Southampton and East Hampton, where tree-lined streets, elegant homes, and boutique-lined Main Streets reflect the relaxed sophistication that has made The Hamptons one of the most sought-after seaside retreats. Along the way, your guide will share about the area's history, architecture, and notable residents.

Continue to the historic waterfront whaling village of Sag Harbor, where beautifully preserved architecture, inviting cafes, galleries, boutique shopping, and a picturesque harbor create the perfect setting for a leisurely afternoon. Take time to stroll, shop, and relax amidst the coastal ambiance before returning to the hotel for the night. Dinner is included this evening. **B D**

Day 6: Bid farewell to Long Island as we journey to Montauk Point, the easternmost tip of New York State. Here, we'll visit the iconic Montauk Point Lighthouse, commissioned by President George Washington in 1792 and recognized as the oldest lighthouse in New York. Perched atop dramatic bluffs overlooking the Atlantic Ocean, this historic beacon has guided mariners for more than two centuries while offering breathtaking coastal views. We continue to Orient Point, where we'll board the Cross Sound Ferry for a scenic cruise across the Long Island Sound. Relax and enjoy the views of the coastline as we make our way to the shores of New England. Upon arriving in New London, CT, we'll continue our journey to the city of Warwick Rhode Island where we shall overnight at The Loom Hotel housed inside the historic Pontiac Mills, the original site of The Fruit of the Loom. **B**

Day 7: This morning we shall experience Newport's grandest summer "Cottage" The Breakers Mansion with a self-guided audio tour. A symbol of the Vanderbilt family's social and financial pre-eminence in the Gilded Age, The Breaker's is the flagship of the Newport Mansions and an icon of the City-by-the-Sea. We then depart Rhode Island and head to the Pilgrim Town of Plymouth Massachusetts. Here we visit Plimoth Plantation, a recreated 17th-century Pilgrim Village and working museum, where interpreters will answer your questions in 17th-century English! Then explore Historic Patuxet, a recreated Native American village where you can learn about the Native people who have lived here for over 12,000 years. An "Eat Like a Pilgrim" lunch is included where we will experience how the Pilgrims ate along with an historical interpreter. Finally, we drive into the center of Plymouth town itself to view Plymouth Rock before traveling onto the Cape Cod peninsular for a 4-night stay at the brand new Margaritaville Resort in Hyannis. **L**

Day 8: Meet our local guide and enjoy a scenic drive out to the very tip of the crooked-finger strip of land that forms the Cape, to Provincetown. It was here that the Pilgrims first landed (not in Plymouth as many believe) and we will see the Pilgrim Monument, a 252-foot tower commemorating their arrival. This afternoon we jump onboard specialized jeeps and drive into the protected dunes of the National Seashore. Knowledgeable local driver guides will share the history and ecology of these beautiful and unique dunes that have inspired so many fine artists and writers. This evening enjoy an authentic New England Clam & Lobster Bake along with world-famous "chowdah"! **B D**

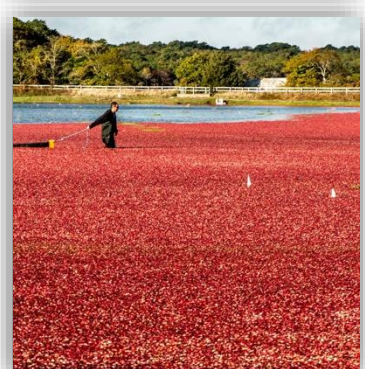
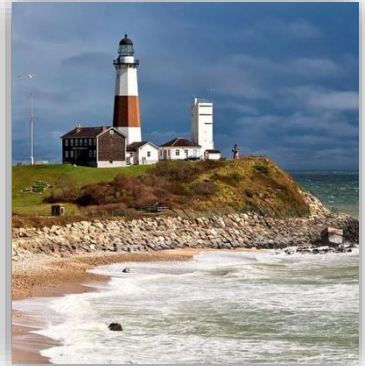
Day 9: Today we ferry to Martha's Vineyard one of two Islands off the Cape, home to the rich and famous such as the Kennedys! Landing at Oak Bluffs, we begin our tour of this popular resort and vacation spot for the wealthy. "The Vineyard" has a relaxed atmosphere. We will travel past cranberry bogs and picturesque cottages of the Islands inhabitants and perhaps converse in that distinctive New England accent that you are bound to pick up! Later, we return to the mainland. **B**

Day 10: The second Island off the coast of Cape Cod is Nantucket, otherwise known as The Gray Lady, which we shall ferry to this morning. Windswept beaches, sand dunes, blinking lighthouses and a charming pace of life awaits us on this 50-square mile island. The world's former top whaling port is now designated a National Historic District. Seaside cottages, old whaling captains' mansions and historic harbors contain quaint inns, boutique stores, chowder shacks and upscale dining delights awaits us. Final night in Hyannis. **B**

Day 11: It's time to depart the Cape and start our journey home, but not before visiting another Cape Cod icon, a family run Cranberry Bog! We shall overnight in Wilmington Delaware with a dinner included this evening. **B D**

Day 12: Journey to Maryland's capital, Annapolis for a guided tour via Golf Cart of the prestigious U.S. Naval Academy. Enjoy lunch at The Alley Restaurant at the Naval Academy Club, before checking into your hotel for the final night in Hagerstown. **B L**

Day 13: Final leg of the journey as we travel back to South Carolina. **B**
